## Pupil Premium 2014-2015 Report/Policy Statement

What is Pupil Premium?		
Pupil premium was introduced by the Government to provide additional funding to address the gap in		
educational attainment and long term economic wellbe		
people compared to their peers. Socially disadvantaged pupils have been defined as pupils eligible for free		
school meals (FSM) at some point in the last six years and children who have been in care for more than six		
months. Currently schools will receive an additional £1300 for each child eligible for FSM or who are		
considered looked after.		
Children whose parents are currently employed by the armed services receive £300.		
Principles for supporting socially disadvantaged pupils:		
At Jessop Primary School we ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all		
pupils.		
• We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this		
includes ensuring that the needs of socially disadvantaged pupils are specifically assessed and		
addressed.		
• In considering provision for socially disadvantaged pupils we recognise that not all pupils eligible for		
FSM will be socially disadvantaged. We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially		
disadvantaged are eligible for free school meals.		
Pupil Premium funding will be allocated based on a needs analysis, reflecting these considerations		
and which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.
