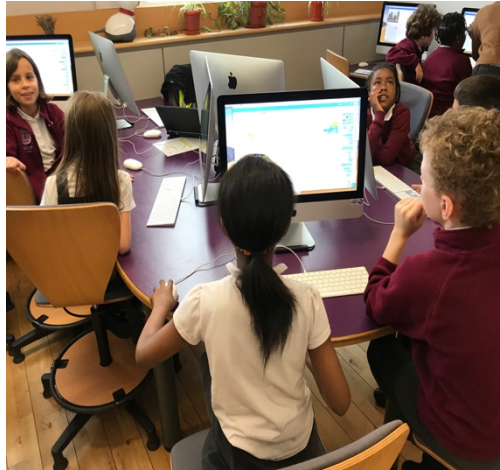
Year 3 trip to the CLC

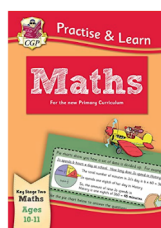
From reading on an escalator to reading whilst swimming, it was a delight to see such wonderful efforts from all of the children involved. Congratulations to our winners!



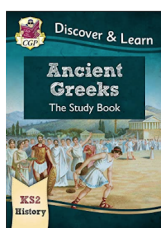
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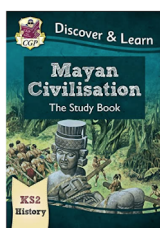
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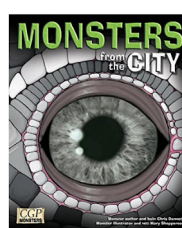

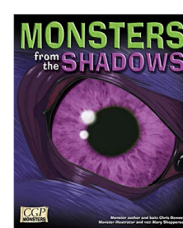

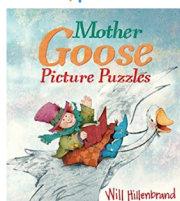
