
ART AND DT Projects

In Year 2 we combined our DT learning with our humanities learning: We made a cart for an explorer (David Livingstone or Robert Falcon Scott) to carry their equipment in. To create the main body of our carts we initially cut a lid into a cereal box. This is done so the explorers can put their equipment in the cart and then close the lid to keep it safe. After this we attached two pieces of wooden doweling together to make the axel. Next, we pierced the sides of the cart and threaded the doweling through. Finally, we attached the wheels to the end of the doweling. Later on, we decorated the carts using paint. We created designs that represented David Livingston or Robert Falcon Scott's expeditions.
