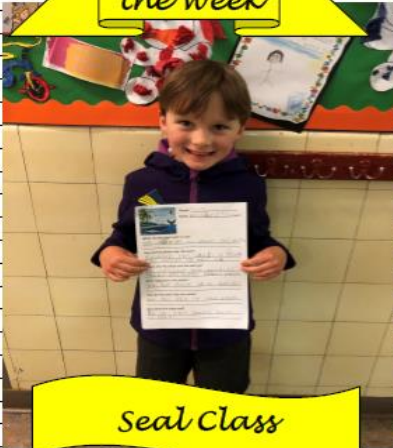
## BLC Spelling Bee Competition

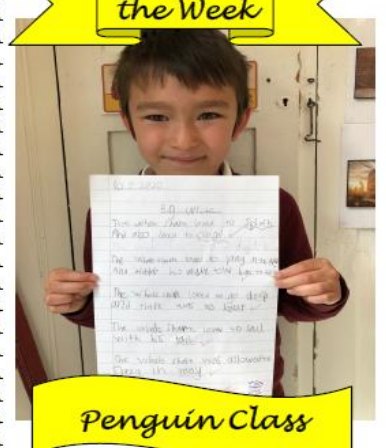

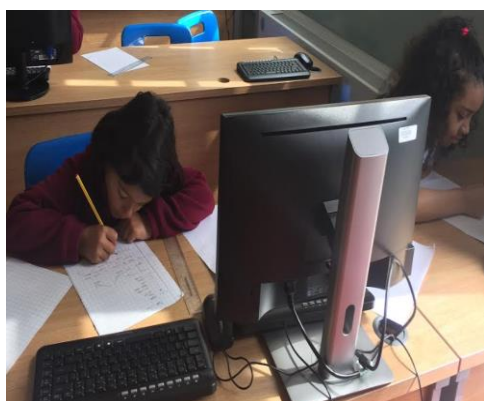
## Year 6 Escape Room

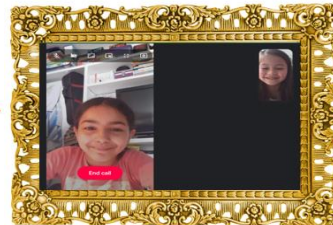
