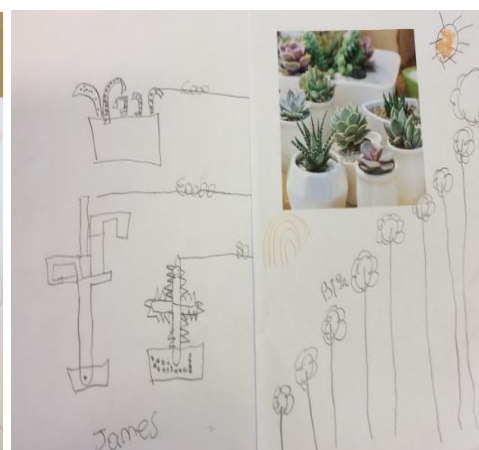
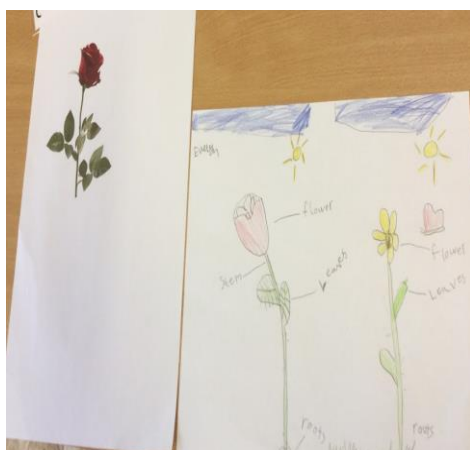


Year 1 – 'Snail Hotel'


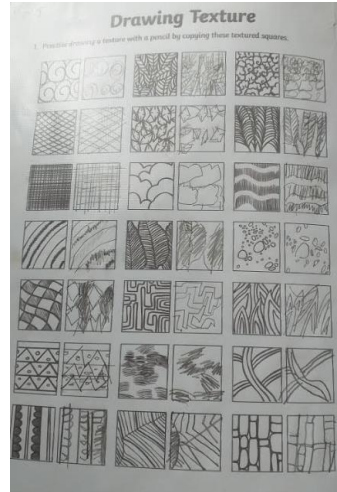
Notes of landmark National Gallery
