

United Against Bullying

Anti-Bullying Week has been absolutely amazing at Jessop this year! The children have been so enthusiastic and thoughtful during their anti-bullying lessons and have gained a solid understanding about what bullying is, what bullying is not, what behaviours constitute bullying, how to deal with bullying if you are a victim and (perhaps most importantly) how to be an upstander, not a bystander. A bystander is someone who watches bullying going on, but does nothing to help or intervene. An upstander is someone who steps in when they witness bullying, shows the victim that they are not alone, and encourages the bully to rethink their behavior. In class this week, the children have been making anti-bullying posters for a whole school poster competition, they have also been contributing to making class worry boxes. On Friday, to raise awareness for anti-bullying, all children came into school wearing purple, the colour of anti-bullying this year. Well done for a fantastic week to all the children and adults at Jessop!

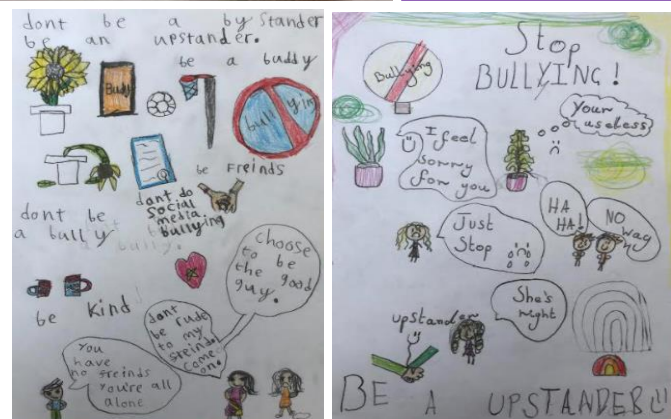
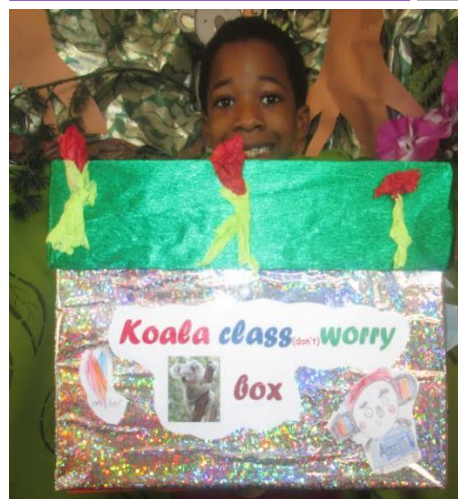
Kangaroo Class has made a beautiful whole class worry box.

Celebrating Children's Learning

Year 5 Gazelles explored their new learning in English about biographies. The children worked collaboratively in identifying the key features of biographies, using different examples.



Ladybirds were learning about matching quantities with numeral numbers. They were provided with an introduction to the lesson through slides, in which there were also some mathematical problems to be solved (counting, matching and writing numerals on their white boards). Then, they put into practice what they had learned by playing an interactive game. The game was about matching numerals with quantities and they took turns to participate. Finally, they were divided into three groups and did an independent activity.



In this PSHE lesson, **Dolphin Class** were able to develop an understanding of bereavement and isolation. We discussed, in depth what the terms meant and thought about times in our own lives when we may have experienced this. We created a safe space and shared our views, opinions and advice. We also participated in full body listening. The lesson was very enjoyable and relevant in relation to the current pandemic.

Year 6 Virtual Workshops

On Tuesday 17th November, Year 6 had a virtual workshop with Simon based on gang violence. We learnt about gang violence and watched videos detailing what happens with gangs. I learnt that at times gangs target young children to help with their illegal activity. They offer them money or protection. I also now know about stereotypes, as we discussed this with our class teacher. I enjoyed the workshop because I haven't explored gang violence before and Simon was very friendly.

Hello, I am a Jessop student in Year 6. Recently, we had a whole class workshop about gangs with a man called Simon. He worked for a company called Going Against Violence and was trying to stop younger people from getting involved in gangs. We were asked three questions about gangs and things we'd heard about them. We answered 'yes, maybe or no' and our teacher counted how many of each. Then Simon showed us animated clips to help us understand better and even told us some stories from the 20 years he served in the police force. We watched some interviews of people who had been in gangs and we spoke about how they recruit. We also looked at pyramid diagrams showing how gangs work. I think that I learned a lot from that session about generally how to keep safe and I think that what GAV does is outstanding!

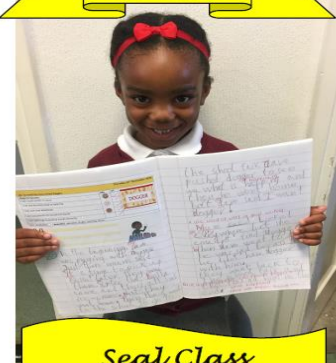
