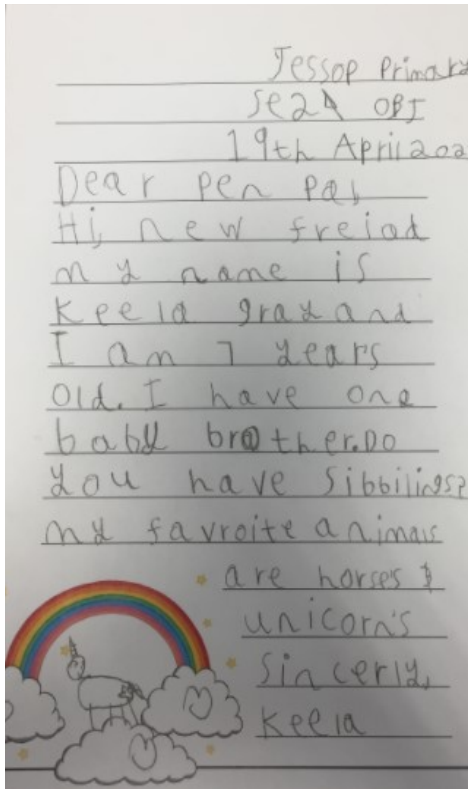

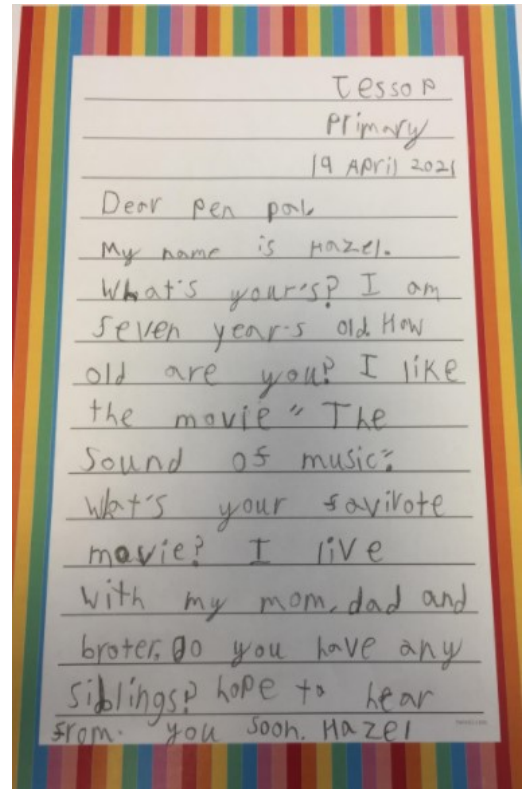

Partnership Pen Pals Project

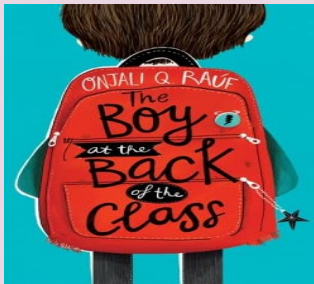

Year 5 Book Club



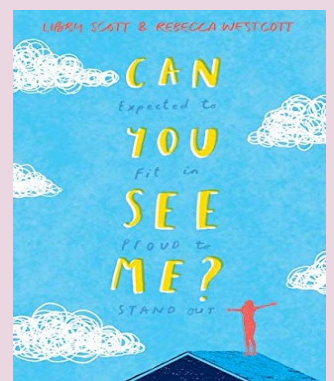

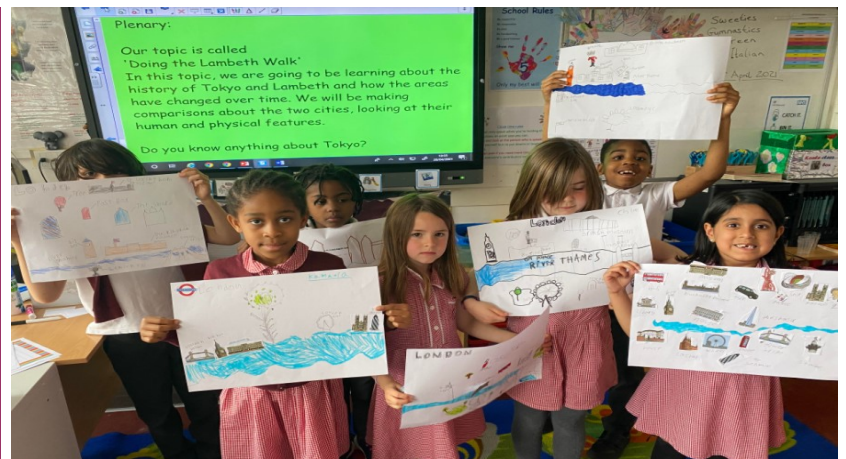

One of the children said: *"Sometimes it is difficult to get beyond our differences but we all need to be appreciated for who we are and feel connected like we belong."*

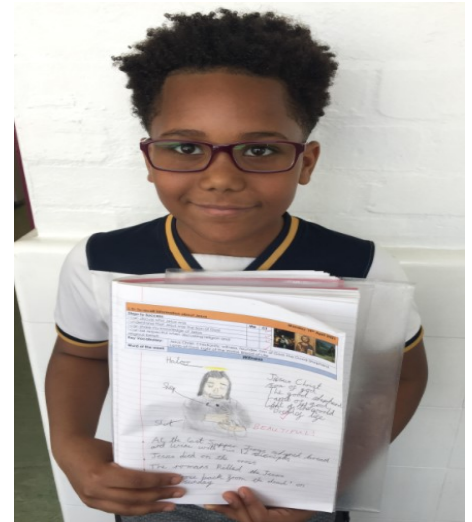

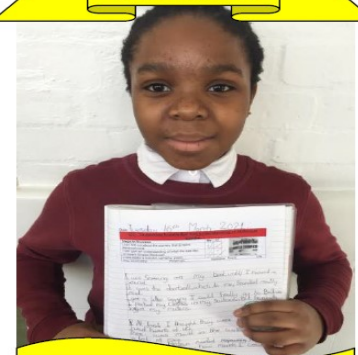

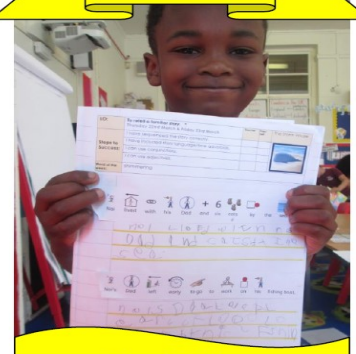
