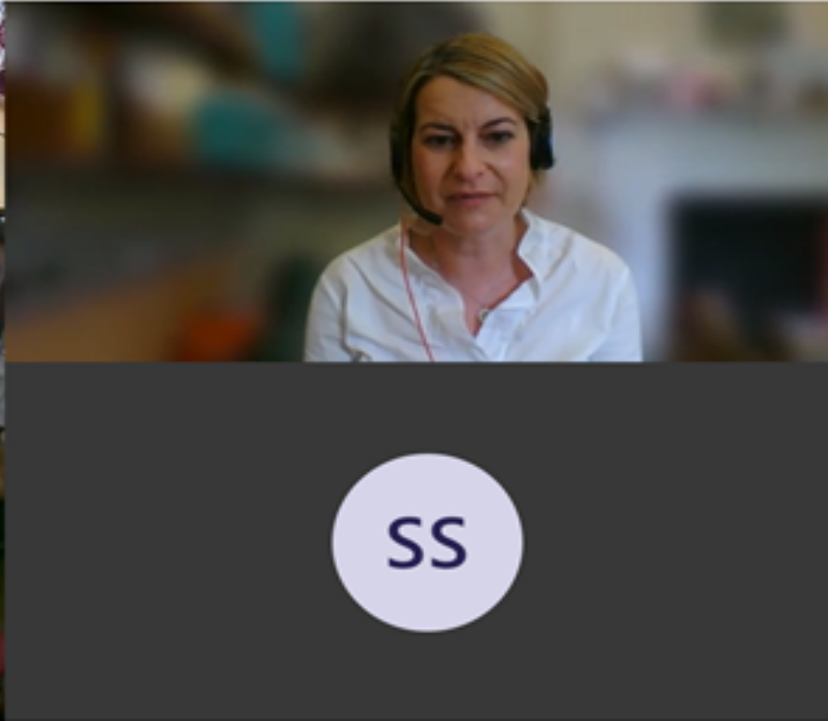
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# Here! Here!...Order! Order!



At Jessop, the pursuit of academic excellence, in all areas of our pupil's development, is not only restricted to what we learn in class but also the importance of social, political and economic affairs in the broader community and wider world. In this vein, we have sought to immerse pupils with a formative awareness of the structures of local and central governance, the democratic process and the guiding values and principles of our nation state. One important way we have been able to achieve this is via our children taking part in a fantastically informative Parliament Workshop. We were privileged enough to have a dedicated Parliamentary expert conduct our sessions. Her brilliant instruction was designed to help young people learn about key moments in history between the Queen and UK Parliament. Covering the interactions between Parliament and the monarchy over the centuries, it also highlighted key pieces of legislation that have and will affect young people.

During the sessions, our children behaved and responded insightfully and intelligently; demonstrating a great grasp of constitutional, culture and societal knowledge. We also covered how:

- The history of how UK Parliament has evolved over time
- The ways in which Parliament and the Monarch have interacted
- Different laws which have impacted citizens and society

Our pupils thoroughly enjoyed participating and were even able to communicate, virtually, with the local MP for Dulwich and West Norwood, Helen Hayes, where they asked probing and thought-provoking questions. These sessions were highly formative and left many of us with even more questions - precisely the inquisitive state we, at Jessop, believe all children should embody throughout their educational journey.
